To all Lions Clubs of District N2:

The warm weather has arrived, and plans are well under way for the 2010 camping season for children with diabetes in Nova Scotia. Every year, many Lions Clubs provide generous support to the Lion Maxwell Diabetes Camp - named almost a decade ago in honor of Lion Peter Maxwell of the Truro Club. Peter was a true gentleman, and a firm believer in the benefit of the diabetes summer camp program to help children who have been diagnosed to stay healthy and happy. The camp was named in honor of Peter Maxwell's commitment, and to provide a legacy to the Lions Clubs of District N2 whose financial support of the program has allowed it to grow and flourish.



Camp Lion Maxwell is the only program of its kind in Nova Scotia. By sending young children to camp, they have a chance to learn the skills they will need to manage their diabetes for a lifetime, and avoid the devastating complications of diabetes such as blindness, and heart disease. The benefits of camp are immeasurable, and the program offers a rare combination of education from a team of medical professionals and peers, with a week of pure fun - a chance for these children to enjoy a regular summer camp experience without needing to feel different or special in any way because of their diabetes.

LAST SUMMER CAMP LION MAXWELL HOSTED ALMOST 100 CAMPERS AND THEIR SUPPORT STAFF, AND DESPITE THE RISING COSTS OF THIS PROGRAM - IT COSTS ABOUT \$1000 PER WEEK FOR EACH CAMPER - THE CANADIAN DIABETES ASSOCIATION HAS MADE A COMMITMENT TO NEVER REFUSE A CHILD ATTENDANCE AT CAMP FOR AN INABILITY TO PAY.

This is where the Lions come in! For those clubs who have already sent in a donation, I hope you feel honored to continue Peter Maxwell's legacy and we thank you on behalf of a child that will greatly benefit from your generosity. If you have not yet made a contribution to this worthwhile program, we ask you to strongly consider supporting a child with diabetes. Every dollar puts us closer to our goal, and helps to ensure that every child in Nova Scotia who would like to attend camp, has a chance to do so.

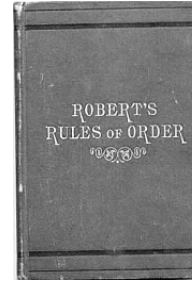

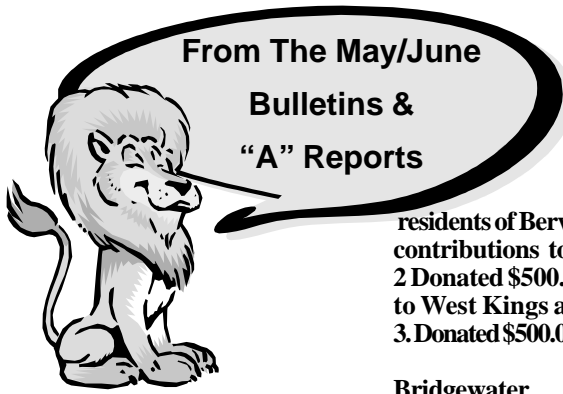

The Truro sisters are thrilled their mother, Shirley Bonnell, is being remembered in a special way thanks to the efforts of the Truro Lions Club.

Shirley passed away last November from cancer at the age of 79. She was an active supporter of the Lions club and the organization is honouring her memory by putting money toward the training of a puppy that will become a guide dog for someone who is visually impaired. The donation of \$100 goes toward training and feeding the puppy and helping with its vet bills.

"I couldn't be happier. It's a way of her remaining in this world through this dog," said Mary. "It will help her memory live on and we're very grateful." Mary said the donation would have made her mother proud. "She was very community minded ... she had an open-door policy and helped others in any way she could." Chrissy said

the donation says a lot about the generosity of the area and Lions club. "It recognizes she was a special person," she said. "And the Lions are so active in helping this community."

Truro Lion member Bucky Daye said people don't realize just how active the organization is in assisting people with visual impairment. "We are knights of the blind ... and do a lot," he said.

The donation in Bonnell's memory is significant because it's the first donation given in memory of a non-member of the Lions club. "Shirley was a strong supporter of our club," Bucky said.

He said the club has also recently spent \$12,000 for the purchase of a fully grown, trained dog to assist a person with autism. The program and matches are done through the Lions Foundation of Canada, so local members do not always know where the matches are made.

Bucky estimated the local club has paid for about 50 dogs over 60 years to assist people with various needs. The club raises the money through fundraisers, including its weekly radio and TV bingos.

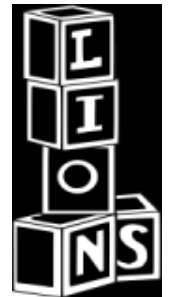
