It has been an honour and privilege to serve as GMT coordinator and I want to thank our amazing team members Lions 1st VDG Rhonda Trickett, Tracey Carroci, Wayne Sears, John MacDonald, ZC Debbie McGinley, Campus Specialist Lion Jeanetta McGinley and the Zone Chairs and Club Membership Chairs for their dedication, commitment and perseverance over the past 10 months toward reaching our District membership goals.

I also want to thank the Bedford Lions Club for sponsoring our district's first campus club, Dalhousie Campus Lions Club and the guiding lions ZC Lion Debbie McGinley, Lion Jamie Harper, PCC Lion Peter Reid, PDG John Stoddart, CCST Lion Brenda Billard, Lion Sarah Hartman and Campus President Lion Jeanetta and Campus Vice President Lion Jessica Johnson who worked many hours on and off the campus to turn this goal into a reality.
