Humanitarian Aid Needed

By now we are all very aware of the terrible situation many Ukrainian citizens find themselves in through no fault of their own. Many of the displaced and probably now homeless refugees are being placed in camps in countries bordering on Ukraine or beyond. Lions Clubs International Foundation has been providing medical supplies, clothing and food since the war began by working with Lions Clubs in the areas where the refugee resettlement work is taking place, and in Ukraine itself. This will not be a short term event. LCIF has no way of knowing how long our assistance will be needed but it is sensible to assume it will be many months or even vears.

Several Lions Clubs have asked how they can help, and what we should do as Lions. District N2 will be collecting club donations at the Convention on April 30th and will forward them on to LCIF where those funds will be forwarded to Lions Clubs in the affected





Today, we made a \$900.00 donation to Kingston & District Elementary School enabling them to purchase their last <u>Self-Regulation Class-room Cognitive Cruiser</u> for their school. These silent bikes, similar to a stationary bike, are placed in classrooms to ensure students have a means of releasing any extra energy in a safe and non-disruptive way and have a multi-position work surface on the handles for reading and writing while burning off energy.
