Humanitarian Aid Needed

By now we are all very aware of the terrible situation many Ukrainian citizens find themselves in through no fault of their own. Many of the displaced and probably now homeless refugees are being placed in camps in countries bordering on Ukraine or beyond. Lions Clubs International Foundation has been providing medical supplies, clothing and food since the war began by working with Lions Clubs in the areas where the refugee resettlement work is taking place, and in Ukraine itself. This will not be a short term event. LCIF has no way of knowing how long our assistance will be needed but it is sensible to assume it will be many months or even years.

Several Lions Clubs have asked how they can help, and what we should do as Lions. District N2 will be collecting club donations at the Convention on April 30th and will forward them on to LCIF where those funds will be forwarded to Lions Clubs in the affected areas.
