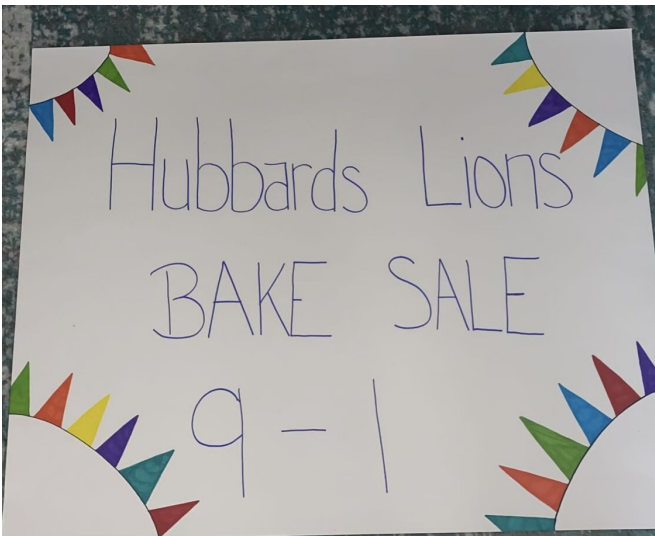






# HUBBARDS
