

She grew up in a family of twelve, so this wasn't her first trip to the dish-pan.

"Seventy-seven years old Oak Parker", Lurla Atwood decided to join the Lion's Club about seven years ago after her husband passed.

"I needed something to do and I've found great friends and a good purpose in this place. I really enjoy it", she says with her hands completely buried in suds n' sink.

When I visited the Lion's Hall 2pm today, Lurla was in her favourite spot. That sink is her community alter. Like a tireless priestess she was baptizing, cleansing, and blessing our community dishes. More amazingly, she was still towering over that same sink, washing those same dishes again after our community meal was finished.

What you gotta love about Lurla is that she's not trying to impress anyone. Fact is, her sink-service requires that she stand in the most inconspicuous place, "back to" to all the people. She could be so easily overlooked. Yet, with her, that's perfectly fine because she's not seeking recognition for her priceless service. And therein lies Lurla's humble greatness!

In all her behind-the-scenes, suds-service Lurla Atwood exudes self-effacing warmth. When I go to thank her for who she is and what she does, Lurla whispers with radiant gratitude: "I'm just doing my little part in caring for others in my community. I'm really privileged to be here helping."

If you ask anyone in the Lion's Club (or anyone who volunteered at today's delicious and free supper), they'll uniformly render praise to Lurla. One lady quips: "Lurla never stops. She's a workhorse ... She's the embodiment of a warm, humble and cheerful servant - eager to put others ahead of herself." Another adds: "You'll barely get a dirty dish laid down before Lurla's got it picked up and all cleaned. She's one of the most valuable members of our kitchen crew - such a good person."

Sharing a few moments with Lurla at the end of this day, I'm so aware of being in the presence of a great human being and a truly humble soul. Lurla's only - and greatest - desire is simply to be "a small part" of something bigger than herself. She intuitively realizes that when human beings merge together for wholesome purposes, everyone is wonderfully lifted to greater heights of connection, generosity, purpose, friendship, and joy.

In fact, it's more than just bellies that get fed at free community suppers. "Givers" and "Receivers" all go home with their hearts fed and filled with a greater connection, a deeper purpose, and a higher JOY!

Yes, in the big picture of all that really matters JOY is what naturally happens when people like our Lurla come together to create, to serve and to share precious time, beautiful conversations, and wholesome community togetherness!

So, wherever you find cheerful servants, free food and lots of dirty dishes, you'll always discover much more than just "a great meal". You will also find an over-flowing abundance of "chicken soup" for the communi-

KINDNESS WEEK

S.C. 2021, c. 9. Assented to 2021-06-03. An Act respecting Kindness Week from <https://lawslois.justice.gc.ca/eng/acts/K-0.7/page-1.html>

Preamble

Whereas kindness encourages values such as empathy, respect, gratitude and compassion;

Whereas kind acts lead to the improved health and well-being of Canadians;

Whereas Kindness Week is already celebrated in some Canadian cities;

Whereas designating and celebrating a Kindness Week throughout Canada will encourage acts of kindness, volunteerism and charitable giving to the benefit of all Canadians;

Whereas Kindness Week will connect individuals and organizations to share resources, information and tools to foster more acts of kindness;

And whereas Parliament envisions that Kindness Week might encourage a culture of kindness in Canada throughout the year;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of

Canada, enacts as follows:

Short Title

1 This Act may be cited as the **Kindness Week Act**.

Kindness Week

2 **Throughout Canada, in each and every year, the third week of February is to be known as “Kindness Week”.**


